

This summer, after thorough deliberation, the coming together of Addington Fund and Forage Aid came to fruition, with the two charities now formally linked.

Addington will continue to deliver the support offered by Forage Aid, retaining the well-known brand and ethos of farmers-helping-farmers. Tom is Chief Executive of the North York Moors National Park, one of 15 National Parks in the UK. With a team of over 100 dedicated staff the National Park Authority is charged with the task of conserving the natural beauty, wildlife and heritage of the

HOUSING UPDATE

At the beginning of 2023 we were faced with a high demand for our Retirement Housing Scheme – so much so that we had to place a temporary pause on accepting new applications (now lifted).

As the months passed, the situation resolved itself with the current landlords having a change of heart on the future of the farm; to estates offering their tenants alternative accommodation which meant we could release the funds we had ring-fenced for these

Although progressing a housing application from start to finish can be time consuming and requires a lot of input from us, and those who apply to us, by acting as a 'safety net' as in the examples mentioned, we can offer the reassurance that if all else fails, there will be a home available when the farm tenancy ends.

We recently produced a video with two of our tenants, Sarah and James Hoskings. They spoke to Annie about how Addington had helped them when ill health and other circumstances led them to need


James Winslade
